# Find It! versus the Catalog

- **Find It!** is a next generation, single-search box tool that provides a dynamic "one-stop" discovery and delivery service to the Library Catalog, the Libraries' Digital Collections, and a mega-aggregated index of hundreds of millions of scholarly e-resources, including articles, e-books, reviews, legal documents, and more.
- Similar to Find It!, the Catalog indexes millions of the Libraries' electronic and physical collections, but unlike Find It!, will not search within the Libraries' databases and does have as many options for refining or limiting down the list of existing results.
- In brief Find it! provides a blanket search of the Library Catalog, the Libraries' Digital Collections, and the majority of the Libraries' databases.





### Databases


- Users can access over 200 databases through the Libraries.

# Subject Guides



# Interlibrary Loan


- If library users are trying to access a book or article that the Libraries does not own the users can make a request through Interlibrary Loan (Illiad).
- This service can be used for research and leisure reading.
- Depending on the availability of the book, article or media resource, the request may take 3-7 days.
- Article requests rarely max out copyright restrictions, but in some circumstances, the user may be asked to pay a small fee to access the article. Users will always be asked before they are charged in these rare scenarios.





# Faculty helping students with the help of the library


- **Reserves:** Reserves is a helpful service that allows students to access supplemental readings for class. Professors often want students to read one chapter of a text. Reserves saves students from buying the book. The Libraries are unable to purchase required material for each class, but instructors can place their own copy of a textbook on Reserves if they are concerned about students' access to course materials.

- **Tutorials**: Professors can assign tutorials to students for additional help or for course credit. In addition to the range of general tutorials, the Libraries have designed a tutorial suite that guides students through topics of academic dishonesty, how to find and evaluate resources, how to cite, etc. Each of the eight tutorials quizzes students and provides them with a certificate upon completion.
- These tutorials can also be accessed through Blackboard.



### Site Search

Site Search will help users navigate through the whole website with the use of keywords.

<u>For example</u> - If you forgot how to find the form to request instruction, search for the word *forms* to find the link or use the **A-Z Library Website index**.



### Search and Find

The mega-menu option for Search and Find covers many of the resources that have previously been covered in this presentation but it also includes a link for how to find **e-books** and **news resources**.

# Locations

Bartle Library & Special Collections - The largest of BU's libraries is the main library on campus. Students visit to access a wide range of research materials and seek out help from subject librarians at the Research Help Desk.



**Science Library -** This library holds the collections for disciplines such as engineering, psychology, geology, chemistry, biology, etc. The map collection is also found here.



**University Downtown Center Library -** Built in 2007, this library is located downtown and holds the collections for the College of Community and Public Affairs.



**Library Annex** contains books and collections that circulate less frequently. The Annex is located in Conklin, and book requests typically arrive in 1-2 days.



### Collections

The Libraries acquire and purchase materials related to all the disciplines supported by the University, and the Libraries also have specialized collections such as:

- Arabic and Hebrew Collections
- Chinese, Japanese, and Korean (CJK) Collection
- Government Documents Collection
- Maps Collection
- Donated copies of BU students' theses and dissertations
- All the collections found in the Special Collections



### Special Collections

Contains rare collections of books, photographs, sound recordings, etc., and also holds the University Archives and local history collections.


